Nursing	.The profession or practice of providing care for the sick.
Florence Nightingale	Florence Nightingale was a British nurse. She was born on the 12 th May 1820 in Italy. She longed to be a nurse but her father wouldn't let her. Eventually, she became a nurse in 1853.
Mary Seacole	Mary Seacole was a nurse, she was born in Jamaica in 1805. Her mother was Jamaican and her father was Scottish. She died in Britain in 1881.
Hospital	Somewhere you go to get medical treatment and nursing care if you are sick or injured. There are many different types of jobs in a hospital some include: doctors, nurses and health care assistants.
